This one day workshop will explore attachment theory and the impact of trauma on brain development to inform interventions with children, young people and their families particularly those who have experienced relational trauma. This workshop will integrate attachment theory with contemporary research in neuroscience and the effects of trauma to develop a framework for understanding the complex presentations of children, young people and families where issues around risk may exist in terms of child abuse and neglect, domestic and family violence, mental health concerns etc.

WHAT DOES THE WORKSHOP COVER?

Learning outcomes for this event will include:

- Increased knowledge of attachment theory and its relevance to work with children, young people and families
- Enhanced understanding of recent research in neuroscience
- Enhanced understanding of the impact of trauma on brain development
- Increased knowledge of child centred practice
- Enhanced understanding in relation to beginnings and endings in working with children, young people and families

WHO IS THE FACILITATOR?

Anita Wass is a psychologist who has been working in the Social Welfare Sector for over 10 years. She has extensive practitioner experience in both government and non-government work with children, young people and adults across a wide range of issues including domestic and family violence, substance misuse and abuse. Anita currently manages a specialist therapeutic service working with children, young people and families in the child protection sector and has recently commenced her own private practice. Her current professional focus is linking contemporary research in neuroscience to attachment theory and clinical practice. Anita uses a range of training methods and will draw from her own practice experience to enhance the learning experience of the workshop.
